WFU London: University Studies & Internships

ACADEMIC PROGRAM: Fall 2017/Spring 2018

- Students are fully enrolled at Queen Mary University of London (QM). Students may only enroll in a course if it is listed below. Students who enroll in courses that are not approved by Wake Forest University will not earn any credit for those courses. All students must maintain full-time enrollment while abroad, which is 12 semester hours. Students are encouraged to enroll in WFU's INS 151 Cross-Cultural Engagement Abroad (1hr p/f) which would increase student hour enrollment to 13 semester hours.
- Students have the choice between two tracks:
 - University Studies: Enroll in four courses directly at Queen Mary alongside local studies.
 - Internships: Enroll in three courses directly at Queen Mary in addition to a fourth internship course. Gain work experience in a variety of placements within London. Credit will be earned as INS 229.
- Courses are not guaranteed to be offered for its associated term. Final course selection depends on available courses and meetings times. Your final course schedule will be set during the Queen Mary registration period.
- Departmental policies on this program:
 - o **School of Business majors**: You must speak with the School of Business concerning your abroad classes
 - o **English majors:** A maximum of 3 ENG courses from this program may count toward the ENG major.
 - Politics & International Affairs majors: A maximum of 9 credit hours from this program may count toward the POL major. If 9 credit hours are counted, no additional domestic transfer credits or courses taken abroad may be used towards the major. If a student has already transferred credit into their POL major, it is their responsibility to discuss this with their abroad advisor.
