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### PROGRAM TRACKS

**The Primary Track (12-15 hours):** No previous Spanish language study required. Students will take one Resident Professor course in January and INS 170 *Contemporary Chilean Language and Culture* (January-May). From March until the program concludes in May, students will choose two to three additional courses.

**The Internship Track (12-15 hours):** Requires the completion of at least five semesters of Spanish at Wake Forest. Students will take one Resident Professor course in January and INS 170 *Contemporary Chilean Language and Culture* (January-May). Additionally, students will enroll in LAS 388 *Internship in Latin American and Latino Studies* and choose one to two additional courses.

**The Honors Track (13-16 hours):** Requires the completion of at least one 200-level Spanish course at Wake Forest. Students will take one Resident Professor course in January and INS 170 *Contemporary Chilean Language and Culture* (January-May). Additionally, students will enroll in LAS 380 *Latin American and Latino Studies Honors Colloquium* (4 hrs), LAS 388. *Internship in Latin American and Latino Studies* and students are encouraged to enroll in one additional course.
